Rector's Letter



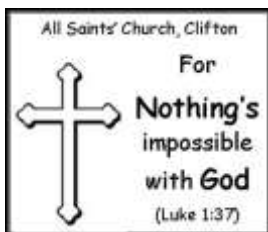
Dear Friends,

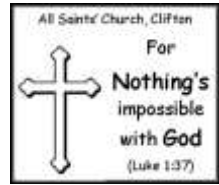

REMI NDERS!

Are you aware of the 'Message in a Bottle' and 'Message in a Wallet' schemes promoted by the Lions and supported by the Care Scheme? These are a simple way of ensuring that all relevant medical information is readily available in the event of an emergency:

- **'Message in a Bottle'** is a small canister containing any information you may wish to disclose to a doctor/paramedic/ ambulance crew even if you are unable to communicate yourself. You enter the details on a form and place in the canister which you then keep in your fridge: there are two stickers provided, attach one inside your front door and the other on your fridge. Emergency services look for these and act accordingly.
- **'Message in a Wallet'** is similar with your details held in a credit card sized clear plastic sleeve which you carry with you at all times.

This information can be of enormous help when diagnosing and treating a patient in an emergency, especially if already taking medication (eg Warfarin) which limits drugs or treatment that may be employed. Both kits are supplied free of charge by the Lions and can be obtained from the Care Scheme by calling the number below.

We received a letter of thanks for our donation from Clifton Care Scheme, also from Clifton Elder Peoples Club for their coach outing to the garden centres at Woburn Sands. Apparently a good day was had by all!

Two of our committee members received awards for volunteering from the 'Star of Aragon Awards' evening. Volunteering is a very worth while experience, and the best part of being a volunteer is that you choose the time that you can give! We were informed that Clifton Streetwatch is looking for volunteers to help them, and of course, we are always looking for committee members to bring our quota up to date.

Healthwatch Central Bedfordshire held their Older Peoples Festival on 2nd October at the Rufus centre in Flitwick. Over 300 people attended to get information from any of the 43 stalls available, and their free ploughman's lunch! At the end of the day £160 was raised for the MacMillan Cancer Charity.

I hope to see you at our AGM. There will be free tea or coffee available, and of course our usual fantastic raffle for just a pound a strip.

CLIFTON SPEED WATCH GROUP



Clifton now has nine active Speed Watch volunteers, with another awaiting training. Naturally, everybody is not available at the same time, but we are fortunate to be able to show an active and effective presence at least twice a week on Clifton's roads

Between 22nd January and the 5th October, 59 traffic calming visits were made to village roads; 5399 vehicles monitored and 249 reported for exceeding the speed limit. Whilst 249 is a high number of speeding vehicles, out of 5399 we have been successful in recording 5150 drivers driving within the speed limit.

I am not naive to think that there are not some drivers who will "put their foot down" when we are not about, but with our consistent traffic calming visits there is an increasing number who are sticking to the speed limit whether the speed cameras are out, or not.

To the 5th October, Church Street has had 8 vehicles reported over 5 visits and none over 3 visits. Pedley Lane has had 16 vehicles reported over 5 visits. Shefford Road had 23 reported over 6 visits and none over 5 visits. Stockbridge Road has had 67 reported over 11 visits. New Road has had 67 reported over 11 visits. Broad Street has had 84 reported in 13 visits. The majority of our visits are during the times of school entry or departure; but during the summer holidays we did change our times to when we thought children would be about, going to the playing field and generally enjoying themselves. Regretfully we had to report 59 vehicles, out of 523, over 8 visits during that period. These figures are included in the figures in the above paragraph. By getting our results to the Police immediately after our visits we are ensuring that the necessary letters are despatched as soon as possible.

In our locality, Arlesey, Campton, Henlow Camp, Langford, Meppershall, Shefford, Stanford and Upper Caldecote speed watch groups have all been monitoring traffic through their towns/villages. Their Coordinators continue to liaise with me on the loan and use of the speed cameras. This way of working was agreed with the police some two years ago as an experiment, and is a system which is now being successfully adopted across Bedfordshire. This replaces the old practice of equipment being delivered by PCSO's, thereby allowing them to concentrate on other matters, saving the force manpower time, use of vehicles, mileage, diesel, and other office commitments.

Thank you for continuing to observe the Clifton speed limits, and those in our neighbouring communities.

Street Watch



During September Clifton had just 4 recorded crimes; all are theft related but thankfully no 'Burglary Dwellings' but involved thefts from sheds and outbuildings.

Once more Church Street suffered most. Sometime between 27/30th, an offender damaged a fence panel to gain access and a shed was broken into but fortunately nothing was taken, however, a plant pot was overturned & broken as presumably thieves searched for a key. The Golden Lion pub, whilst being refurbished, was broken into on 25th. Despite having considerable difficulty gaining entry, the thieves managed to steal power tools and light fittings.

Two incidents occurred in Brickle Place, a resident reported the theft of hanging baskets on 15th, also in the same area a pedal cycle, left unattended and insecure, was stolen from a front garden. A male aged between 16 & 20 years was observed riding off.

Although we cannot stop these unscrupulous characters from attacking our properties, we must maintain vigilance & report anything you might regard as suspicious. However, we can help ourselves by purchasing from our local PCSO – Gill Richardson, "SmartWater" which is available at a greatly reduced price of £15 and provided free of the normal yearly registration cost. This product truly reduces the potential threat of theft by property marking all types of items from small valuables such as rings & watches to garden items, power tools, lawn mowers etc.

Saturday 19th our SW team were accompanied by 4 of our local PCSOs as we blitzed the village promoting Street Watch and searching for new recruits to develop our team. Many residents supported our work and some showed interest in joining our group. Maybe you would also like to join us, please contact me for further information, alternatively check it out on our website at <http://www.street-watch.org> We have received disturbing news that our Beds Police are proposing to reduce the number of PCSOs by half from the present 95 officers to just 44. Bedfordshire are targeted to save £17m over the next 4 years. The proposal is to have front line officers, who have more powers, involved with communities. However, Government is in the process of a new "All County Funding Review" that if approved should provide our constabulary with more cash, maybe these personnel reductions would then not be needed.
