If you've recently visited our Community Centre in Whiston Crescent you will not have failed to notice your Parish Council has been making improvements to it, both inside and out.

There was a little disruption whilst the works were being carried out but overall, it went very smoothly. This is what's been done:

- The lobby and hallway walls have been plastered to provide a more welcoming entrance area. (When you read this it may be painted!).
- The main hall was given a facelift last year with sound reducing plaster and new curtains.
- The sinks in the lady's loo have finally got hot water! (We know how to spoil you!).
- The committee room has new curtains to match the main hall.
- There's a sparkling new kitchen!
- Some improvements have been made to the bar area which now boasts an additional hot water supply and a glass washer.
- Outside, the new solar panels gleam in the sunlight, and even work when it's raining.
- The enclosed children's play area has been refurbished and outside the swingy thingy* has been replaced and some safety matting laid.

*No doubt the swingy thingy has a proper name but I've no idea !

In the near future the Council is going to install some new LED lighting in the entrance as well as the kitchen and is constantly looking for ways to make the Centre even better than it already is.

Our AGM was held in February, and I am very pleased to have some new faces on the committee to help steer the club moving forwards. and extend my sincerest thanks to those departing us this year for all the work and efforts that they have put in over the past few years.

On the 1st of March we held our second quiz night at the Clifton Community Centre which was a truly fantastic evening and again raised some vital funds for the club. My thanks to outgoing Social Secretary, Adam Ryan, for all his efforts in organising the event.

At both the AGM and the Quiz night we revealed our proposed drawings to the public for our new pavilion. For those unaware of the situation, in January 2023 we had a burst pipe in our pavilion which has rendered it unusable. As a committee we have decided that the best course of action is to rebuild in order to ensure that there is a suitable facility for cricket to be played in the village for decades to come and I can confirm that a planning application has been submitted to the relevant authorities.

This of course comes with considerable expense that we will need help in reaching funding goals to achieve. We are still in conversation (a never ending roll of red tape seemingly) with our insurance company to help start a cash injection. But should anyone reading this know of any grants, willing donors, lost treasure or cash cows that are able to assist then please do let us know via the contact details at the front of the magazine.

I hope to be able to provide further updates on this in due course. But for now I wish you all a wonderful spring into summer and warmly invite all down to the Claybridge ground to enjoy the sunshine and a drink.

Can You Help Us?

Successive churchwardens of All Saints' Church over the centuries, have had responsibility for the fabric of the church. It's an interesting use of the word fabric as in this context it means the building and the surrounding churchyard.



All Saints' Church was last decorated in 1979 and our major project for 2024-2025 is to have all the inside of the church painted. As a listed building, we can't just give it a lick of paint! The Church Architect has to compile a Specification and Schemes of Work and approval has to be sought from the Diocese of St Albans which is like planning permission. Quotes are sought from companies used to working in churches and then there's the need to pay the bill at the completion of each stage.

There are 3 stages:

- 1. Removal of decayed/loose plaster. This took place over 4 days last month and the church is again open each day for visitors to see what lays behind the uncovered areas.
- 2. These areas need to dry out before lime putty based render can be used to re-plaster so it's fingers crossed for warm Summer months so the plasterer can return in September.
- The new plaster needs time to 'cure' that's dry out to you and me before the decorator can start painting in 2025! Special paint, Classidur Tradition and/or Zinsser Grade 1, will be used on all the walls, 2 coats to existing plaster and 3 coats to the newly plastered areas.

The total cost for this project will be approximately £50K. There are sufficient funds to pay for Stage 1 and we'll be applying for grants to help towards Stages 2 and 3 but applications aren't always successful so various members of the congregation and our friends in the village are currently planning lots of fund raising activities through the coming months. These will include concerts, a Quiz Night, August Afternoon Teas, the Farm Run, the Flower Festival and what else?

Are there other events that we've not thought about?

Would you like to lead a fundraising event of your choice?

Would you sponsor a litre of paint? Its name alone tells us that it's very expensive and we're waiting to hear how many litres will be needed!



Please get in touch with me if you can help in any way, however small that might be. My contact details are on page 4 of The Chronicles and as a certain advert goes "every little helps".
