



## **Clifton Neighbourhood Plan**

On Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> November, residents of Clifton voted either "yes" or "no" to this question:

'Do you want Central Bedfordshire Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Clifton Parish to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'



There were 678 votes cast, and the result was clearcut. "Yes" received 648 votes, (95.6%), and "No" received 30 votes, (4.4%). No matter where you put your cross - thank you for taking the time to vote.

We now have a Neighbourhood Plan. It will be used by CBC alongside planning law and the National Planning Policy Framework, (issued by HM Government), when development decisions for Clifton are being made.

This will make speculative planning applications less likely to succeed.

It is important that the Plan remains relevant and up to date, so written into it is a requirement that the Parish Council review it every three years.

Since this is almost certainly our very last Neighbourhood Plan update, we would like to take this final opportunity to thank everyone who helped to produce it. It wasn't easy – many other villages have failed, whilst others consider it too difficult and time consuming to even attempt.

The names of everyone who contributed time, effort and resources to pulling it all together are printed on page 117 of the Plan.

Finally, you may be interested in how much all this has cost you, (via your Parish Council). Many Neighbourhood Plans have cost their communities tens of thousands of pounds, (we've even heard, anecdotally, of one costing £100,000!)

Your Clifton Neighbourhood Plan cost £51.35. We hope you don't mind...


#### **Margaret Brewer**
