# **Nothing's** impossible with God



Dear Friends,

"It was the best of times; it was the worst of times" so penned Charles Dickens at the start of 'A Tale of Two Cities'. So it is today as we approach Mothering Sunday – Refreshment Sunday (15<sup>th</sup> March). Traditionally a family time when we show our appreciation for our Mums. I always give a card to my Mum and also to a lovely lady who has no family at all, but who has given me a precious amount of 'mothering'.

However, I spent some time working in the Women's Hospital in Liverpool, where we had women undergoing termination on one ward, and next door were those receiving attention for infertility. How Christ-like the atmosphere was there, in which each woman was held in the utmost respect with no blame, no shame, no criticism, just loving care & compassion. These women were ones for whom the prospect of, or denial of motherhood posed a challenge and turmoil too difficult at times for them to reconcile. For many it remains a secret ache, hidden for years. Then of course we have those who's Mums are no longer with us, and those who've been traumatised by the loss of a child.

Maybe it helps when we look to Mary (Lady Day 25<sup>th</sup> March) who also knew such personal tragedy, and ever lives to offer us consolation and point us to Jesus, who himself exercises the gift of Mothering when he said, "Jerusalem, Jerusalem.... How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings...." (Matthew 23:37)

## **CLIFTON SPEED WATCH GROUP**

During school entry or departure times your Speed Watch volunteers were out on 60 occasions between 13<sup>th</sup> January and 12<sup>th</sup> December last year. Out of well in excess of 5,000 passing vehicles we had to report 254. In addition to our traffic calming visits, between 7<sup>th</sup> January and 29<sup>th</sup> December visits by the Mobile Camera Van, and other police units, resulted in a further 441 vehicles being reported.



Our local groups of Arlesey, Broom, Campton, Langford, Meppershall, Shefford, Southill, Stanford and Upper Caldecote will, from the 24<sup>th</sup> February, be joined by the newly formed Henlow group. The current number of Speed Watch Groups in Bedfordshire now stands at 77, with a total of 572 volunteers. With the new StarDome letter generating system now available to us, letters to owners of recorded vehicles, are now being sent out within two days.

To help cope with the growing interest in local Speed Watch Groups, more meetings are being held to allow Coordinators across the County to meet and discuss local issues; as well as the introduction of a Speed Watch News and the launch of an on-line forum. Regular training events are also being held. At the last Coordinators meeting Mark Turner, the Chief Executive of the Road Victims Trust, came along to make volunteers aware of the work of that charity. He was very supportive of the traffic calming work carried out by the growing number of Speed Watch Groups in the County. More information about the Trust can be found on www.rvtrust.org.uk.





# **Clifton Street Watch**

I recently received a report from our Chief Constable, Collette Paul, reminding us all of the need to "Protect People & Fight Crime Together" in Bedfordshire and of course throughout the UK in general. This especially relevant following the recent terrorist attacks in Paris, Belgium and around the world,



senior counter-terror officers have warned of a 'heightened' concern around the potential risk to certain groups including those working in policing and members of the Jewish and Israeli community.

Bedfordshire Police will be working with our communities and with our law enforcement partners across local, regional, national and international boundaries to work together to protect people and keep Bedfordshire safe. Any suspected hate crime incidents should be reported to the police on 101, along with any concerns around individuals or groups suspected of wanting to cause harm to our communities.

On a more local front, crime in Central Bedfordshire has generally fallen year on year substantially over the last 12months, and in Clifton we have witnessed a huge reduction from a high point 12 months ago of 20 incidents to a low in this quarter of just 3 crimes reported, namely a burglary, a vehicle crime and one incident of criminal damage. Compare those statistics in our village today, with those highs of 2005/08, our crime stats have dropped by more than 80%. To retain these figures we must continue to be vigilant in the protection of residents.

Our Street Watch teams across Bedfordshire disappointedly lost a dedicated SW volunteer and community champion, when our good friend and hardworking colleague, John Plummer, the County Co-ordinator for Bedfordshire, moved home back to Norfolk. John, from his home in Ampthill, took charge of the Street Watch scheme back in 2009. At the time it looked likely to collapse but since then he has provided the back bone and support to develop SW in a number of villages, helping protect residents and making Central Beds a great place to live. We all wish him and his family happiness in their new life.

Our new leader PCSO Juliet , will we believe have a much wider roll, with control over the three main "Watch" schemes in the County, namely Street, Speed & Neighbourhood Watches. Hopefully this amalgamation and joint coordination will enhance & strengthen the protection of the Bedfordshire community.
