# A CHALLENGE

When asked where I live, I say “Clifton” and add “ a village with a duck pond, a very old church, two shops, two pubs, and a lot of very nice people”. That usually makes the enquirer jealous. Now, a centre piece of our village faces a challenge. One brought about by the ravages of time. The fabric of our lovely church building, which dates back to about 1320, though the present structure owes much to re-modelling in 1862, needs repair, and quite costly repair at that.

Twenty odd years ago, a Charitable Trust was formed to create a restoration & repair fund for the church building. It became dormant, but has now been re-activated as the “Friends of Clifton Parish Church”. I am one of those Friends because I think our church building is a landmark structure which gives an identity to our village.

There are not that many Friends at the moment, but we hope to raise some money for the Trust by having fun, probably involving eating and drinking, at some social events, and we may well stray outside the village to do so. The idea is four events a year, and the first one has been pencilled in for 20<sup>th</sup> May, and will probably involve hurling wooden balls at wooden pegs.

Now, no way is what the Friends can raise going to solve the problems that have been caused to the church by wind, water, and wear. There is a good chance that some grants may be available to cover major expenditure, but such grants will not allow work to be done which maintains the beauty and identity of the church as a village landmark. A landmark which, I think, gives the village a visual focus.

So, why not join me in helping to preserve a little bit of the village, and have some fun whilst doing so.

# CLIFTON CARE SCHEME



WHAT COSTS LESS FROM APRIL 1<sup>st</sup>?

From 1<sup>st</sup> April we are lowering the charge for transport from 45p/mile to 40p/mile. This is a result of the lower price of fuel at the pumps which looks to be with us for some time yet, despite daily minor fluctuations on forecourts around the region.

Our mileage charge is constantly monitored and of course it has to allow for much more than the cost of fuel. We allow for any costs which are directly attributable to miles driven (such as increased depreciation, maintenance and wear-and-tear all of which are constantly rising). We do not apportion the standing cost which drivers would bear if they were not volunteers.

We do not make a profit from these activities and our guiding principle is that the users should receive a service at the lowest possible cost while ensuring that volunteers (who donate their services without charge) are not left out-of-pocket.

A new schedule of charges will now be with each driver which shows the effect of the reduction; for example a return trip to Shefford Health Centre will be reduced from £1.60 to £1.40 while journeys to Bedford Hospital South Wing will be down from £10.40 to £9.20.

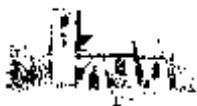

# Clifton Street Watch



Clifton has had a relatively quiet time during the past month, crime stats tell us we had just three incidents of crime, Burglary - from a rear garden in Bilberry Rd, several vehicle batteries stolen. Criminal Damage – windows smashed on a vehicle in Pedley Lane. Drugs offence – cannabis seized from a Sam Whitbread pupil.

Unfortunately, towards the end of the month, we had 4 additional Burglary (other) attacks, involving thefts from gardens, garages and outbuildings. Three of these incidents happened on 12th February, with Church St, New Rd & Shefford Rd being affected. 10 days later the 4<sup>th</sup> offence occurred in Stanford Lane. Items stolen included cash, tools and spirits. These offences are a timely reminder to pay attention to the security of both your exterior and interior premises.

Clifton remains a very safe environment in which to live, our crime statistics show crime has reduced year on year, with your help as our community is more aware and help our neighbours, we can maintain this downward trend.

One burglary incident that occurred over the Christmas period on Clifton Park encouraged our Police colleagues to hold a mini surgery for their residents. Despite the bitterly cold weather it was very well attended. Police plus Lynne Arch from PCC/Neighbourhood Watch were on hand to offer advice and provide anti-crime products. Purse bells, anti-tamper screw packs, light timers were issued & smart water was purchased by at least 6 residents. Police also provided more than a dozen crime-prevention packs and a further 20 or more packs were left in reception for those residents who didn't attend.

Bedfordshire Police is seeking potential new recruits after recently welcoming 33 new officers. Emphasis will be on attracting experienced officers from across the country as well as those looking to embark on a new career in policing. The force is particularly interested in attracting those who live locally, have local knowledge and reflect the diverse communities the force serves. Could this interest you?

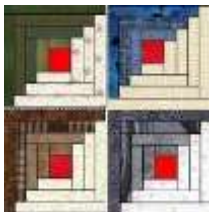

## NOW BACK TO THE 16<sup>TH</sup> CENTURY.....

Ickwell May Day Festival was first documented in the Churchwarden's accounts of c1565 and has continued ever since, apart from a break at the time of the Puritans. A permanent Maypole was first erected in 1872.

The Festival this year will be on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> May. Biggleswade Sandy Lions will be there as usual and plan to have their skittles, golf and duck games as well as a lucky dip, books and bric a brac. Come and have fun. The money we raise will help us help the local community.

Originally, Maypoles were young trees cut down and stuck in the ground. People danced around to celebrate the end of winter with the start of the fine weather to allow planting to begin. Maypoles were once common all over England and the tallest is said to have been erected on The Strand in London in 1661 standing over 143 feet high. It was felled in 1771 when Sir Isaac Newton sent it to a friend in Wanstead to support the then largest telescope in Europe. The name of St Andrew Undershaft in Cornhill derives from a large Maypole set up in front of it.
