



Clifton Street Watch

Our village community had just 3 recorded crimes during March, all involving vehicle crimes. A set of number plates were stolen from a vehicle in Broad St; Rear tyres were slashed on a vehicle in Bilberry Rd and a vehicle parked in the communal parking area in Manor Cl was



"keyed", intentionally scratched, causing many £'s of damage. Anyone having any information regarding these incidents could they please contact our Police colleagues on 101.

It seems vehicle crime appears to have been on the increase recently in Bedfordshire, other local villages have seen a considerable rise in theft from motor vehicles. In most cases owners have been somewhat at fault by leaving valuable articles on show. You are reminded to stow all valued items, such as satellite navigation products, brief cases, tools, coats & packages in the boot or better still take them into your property. Even the most small and insignificant wrap parcel can encourage a speculative thief a chance to cause major damage to your vehicle.

On Saturday 28th March, together with others from our village, I attended a very interesting "Volunteer Day" at the Rufus Centre in Flitwick. The day was involving volunteers throughout all parts of the county and how they were helping keep Bedfordshire safe in conjunction with our Police colleagues. Street, Speed & Neighbourhood Watch volunteers were all in attendance, together with our Police Cadets, Specials & Road Victims Trust personnel.

Presentations by various senior personnel from some of these groups, including Superintendent Paul Schoon & Mark Turner, Chief Executive of RVT, provided a wonderful insight into how volunteers are helping our Police cope with the ever demanding ways to reduce cost and help our communities. CLIFTON SPEED WATCH GROUP

To the 25th March this year your Speed Watch Group has been out on 15 separate occasions; visiting Broad Street, Church Street, New Road, Shefford Road and Stockbridge Road. Of the 1427 vehicles passing during those visits we have had to report 59. Using the new Stardome letter generating system letters were sent out to the offending motorists within two days.



Having recently been asked by one resident for further information on the group, I am hoping that we might be gaining another recruit, If there is anybody else interested in helping out in traffic calming in our village please get in touch.

The Neighbourhood, Speed and Street Watch County Coordinators have been meeting, as a working group, for well over a year to ensure that groups do not work in isolation. In recognition of the contribution of the various voluntary groups across the county to the goal of a safer Bedfordshire, a meeting of representatives of the groups was held at the end of March. The meeting was titled "Celebrating Volunteer Day" and held at the Rufus Centre, Flitwick. The Police and Crime Commissioner, and senior police officers each gave a presentation. Superintendent Paul Schoon in speaking on how volunteers contribute highlighted the work of Speed Watch, with its 609 volunteers, in traffic calming education and its contribution to the significant reductions in casualty rates, and associated costs to the rate payer. Each slight injury collision costs in the region of £16,300.

Mark Turner, the Chief Executive of the Road Victims Trust, also spoke of the contribution of Speed Watch in reducing accidents.

A Speed Watch demonstration was given out side the venue, in the Steppingley Road.

Thank you for driving within the speed limits through Clifton, and our neighbouring communities; because if we want others to drive safely through Clifton, we need to drive responsibly through theirs.



Baptisms in Clifton Church





It is lovely to conduct so many baptisms of adults and children. We have a wonderful happy service of celebration. Families tend to ask me very similar questions, so I thought I would bring some clarity for you and your children.

The minimum number of godparents is 3, and they must all be Baptised (Christened). In many cases the prospective **godparents haven't been baptised**, **so it is usual for me to** baptise them before the baby in the same service. Everyone enjoys those fabulous occasions.

Another matter is choosing the date and time. In Clifton and Southill we offer the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Sundays of the month at 2.00 pm. We ask the families if they would like to choose a hymn from the selection in the booklet.

There is no cost for baptisms, however, we take a collection during the second hymn to help towards the upkeep of the church, heating and lighting costs. We offer families special time at the end of the service to take photographs around the font or in front of the altar.

Anyone can be baptised at any age, from birth upwards. There is no set protocol for that. Please contact the wardens or myself should you wish to book a baptism.

This Defibrillator is part of the Community Heartbeat Trust's ambition to place Defibrillators in rural locations where Ambulances or Paramedics will take longer to arrive.

The machine is only of use to people in Cardiac Arrest



(when your heart stops pumping)

When this happens time is short.

On phoning 999 for the Ambulance you will be given the Key Code for the Defibrillator case. Emergency services will also be despatched.

If the pub is open they have the code behind the bar

On opening the Defibrillator it will tell you exactly what to do.

We hope you will never have to use the Defibrillator but if you do need one its in The Admiral car park.

Chicksands Priory

Chicksands Priory is a grade 1 Listed Building, a Scheduled Ancient Monument and now an Officers Mess situated in the middle of a MoD base, the Joint Intelligence Training Group, just west of Shefford.



Originally it was founded as the third largest of the Gilbertine Priories in the late 12th century. The Gilbertine order was unique insofar that on several sites there was a double house with accommodation for both nuns, who followed the Cistercian Rule and canons who were ordained priests and who followed the Augustinian Rule. The land at Chicksands was given to the order by Payne de Beauchamp, feudal lord of Bedford and whose widow Rohese later became a prioress there. It is the only house to be founded during the lifetime of St Gilbert (1083?-1189) outside his own county of Lincolnshire.

After the Dissolution of the Monasteries by Henry VIII in 1538, Chicksands came into the possession of the Osborn family in 1576 and remained so until 1936, when Sir Algernon Osborn, 7th Baronet sold it to the Commissioners of Crown Lands.

The first owner, Peter Osborn was a lawyer and an MP who later procured the hereditary post of Lord Treasurer's Remembrancer in 1552. After his death in 1592, his elder son Sir John is thought to have been the first Osborn to have lived a Chicksands. It is believed that by this time both the monastic church and one cloister had been completely demolished. His third son, John, was created a baronet by Charles II in 1662 in recognition of all the suffering the family had suffered in the Royalist name during the Civil War.

In the 1740s Sir Danvers Osborn, 3rd Bt, employed Isaac Ware to

remodel the interior of the priory. General Sir George Osborn, 4th Bt, from 1813 to 1816 made extensive alterations to the priory adding an entrance porch, cantilevered staircase and gothic arches in the south cloister, designed by the architect James Wyatt. This is how we see the priory today.

After the sale in 1936, RAF Chicksands was set up in 1939 and from 1941 it served as a communications centre and an intercept facility, home to some 'Y' Service personnel, whose intercepted messages were sent to Bletchley Park for deciphering. Messages intercepted at Chicksands contributed to the sinking of the battleship Bismark. In 1950 RAF forces were joined by USAF personnel who remained until 1995. Since that time, the base has been home to the UK intelligence forces and is now the Joint Intelligence Training Centre.

Chicksands Priory is open to the public, by prior arrangement, on the first and third Sunday afternoons from April to October. As well as individuals and families, groups of up to 40 are also welcome. For further information, please visit our website: www.chicksandspriory.co.uk.
