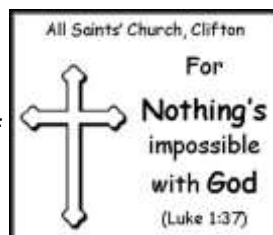
At the end of July we said goodbye to our organist and choir mistress, Susan Sims. Susan first played at All Saints as a deputy organist in 1998; in recent years she developed the community choir and over the last two years has taken our church choir to a very high standard showing great enthusiasm and commitment in everything she has done. We wish her well in her new post at St. Marys, Maulden.

Revd. Anne returns to the parish this month rested and inspired by her travels in the Lake District studying spirituality and the poet Wordsworth. We welcome her back and look forward to sharing in her inspiration.

August will see a change in the pattern of services at All Saints. 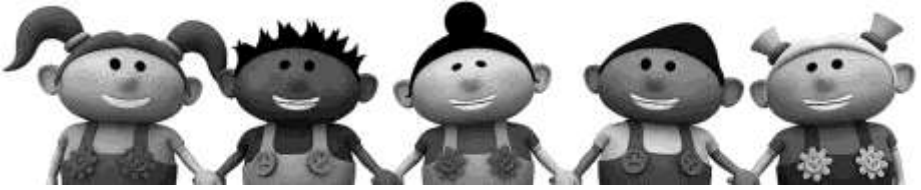

Burglaries in Clifton

Bedfordshire Police, in the form of safer-beds.org have reported three burglaries in Clifton this month.

One took place in Church Street, where the offenders were disturbed by the owner's dog. (I **like** that - I hope the dog was big and bad-tempered.) Outbuildings in Grange Street and Broad Street were broken into. In addition over one night a caravan was broken into, a garage entered and also a house broken into, all in or around Church Street.

The advice from Bedfordshire police is:

- Make your boundaries difficult or impossible to climb over.
- Keep doors and windows locked at all times.
- Remove all keys from the locks and keep them in a safe place out of view.
- Keep hallways clear of valuables like keys, handbags and laptop where they may be seen.
- Check that side gates are locked.
- Keep bins, ladders and garden furniture locked away.
- Fit Window Restrictors to fanlight windows.
- Secure gates, keep fences and walls in good repair and consider defensive planting or trellis.
- Keep sheds in good repair. Make sure that hinges and hasps are correctly fitted.
- Use a good quality padlock to secure the door.
- Ensure that you have good lighting that covers all areas of the property.
- Consider fitting a shed alarm.
- A security cage can be installed inside the shed to secure tools and valuables.
- Report any suspicious activity in neighbouring gardens.

Keep Safe and look out for your neighbours.

Clifton Street Watch



Unfortunately, Clifton has had a slight increase, compared with this period last year. Thirteen crimes were registered, an increase of three compared with 2014. Most of these were not what we would normally consider a danger to the public, however all crimes are a major upset for the persons affected.

Very recently, 3rd July a burglary took place in Shefford Rd, a messy search resulted in the thieves stealing items including jewellery. Another burglary happened only yesterday between 8pm and 8am, the thieves force entry into an out building by cutting the padlock to remove valuable power tools.

We also experienced three vehicle offences this month, the first of which happened in Whiston Crescent 29th June, a person by unknown means, entered the vehicle damaging both steering wheel and lock. Then just a couple of days later, a side window of a vehicle in Church St was smashed to enable a bag to be stolen. Only yesterday, as I write this report, an unsecured vehicle in Pedley Lane was entered and a laptop stolen.

Our community residents are reminded to ensure your vehicles are **securely locked** at all times. You should remove all items from your vehicles, put them out of sight in the boot or better still take them into your property for safe storage. Another tip is to clean from marks made by Sat Navs, thieves look for this as an easy target which might encourage a break-in.

We also had a couple of incidents in June of Criminal Damage. In Broad St, a known offender was caught throwing stones at the windows of a property and later in the month unknown offenders damaged fencing panels in Yew Tree Walk. There was also a reported sexual incident at Stanford Woods on the 2nd June.

WITNESS THE CEREMONY OF THE KEYS

The Ceremony of the Keys dates back Centuries, and is held every night at H.M. Tower of London, featuring the Yeoman Warders and a contingent of soldiers. It is the ceremonial locking up of the Tower. It is one of the shortest military ceremonies, but is still full of pageant and history, and never fails to stir the senses when witnessed. There is now an opportunity for Chronicle readers to see this unique ceremony.



The Friends of Clifton Parish Church have been allocated 50 places to witness the Keys Ceremony on **Saturday 31st October**. The visit will include a short private tour of the Tower of London, a two course cold buffet supper in the Yeoman's Mess, the ceremony itself, and a chance to sample some beverages from the bar in the Mess, which is the private club of the Yeoman Warders.

A coach will be laid on to take us from Clifton to the Tower, for a 7.30pm tour start. About three-quarters of an hour later we should be in the Mess, where the buffet (provided by the wives of the Yeoman) will be served, though you will have to go down into the dungeon to make your choice, before enjoying the hospitality of the Mess. The ceremony is at 10pm, and a little later the coach will pick up us for the return.

The cost is £25 per head for signed up Friends, and £30 per head for anyone else. Attendees must be 16 years old, and there is a dress code. Booking will be on a first come, first served basis, to me at the e-mail address shown below, though telephone bookings can be made.

It should be a great outing. Onwards and upwards after our great success at skittles in Broom. This is event two in our programme, aimed at providing great social events whilst raising funds for the fabric of our magnificent village church.

Bereaved Three Counties Families To Benefit From Extra Funding

CLIFTON SPEED WATCH GROUP



I have left writing this round-up of traffic calming visits to the last possible moment, in order to include to-day's (10th July) visit to Church Street.

Between 22nd January and the 10th July there have been 42 visits to village roads, resulting in 4081 vehicles being monitored, and 142 reported for exceeding the speed limit.

To date, Church Street has shown the best results, with 8 vehicles reported over 7 visits; 2 of the 7 visits showing no vehicles being reported. Pedley Lane has had 5 visits, with 16 vehicles reported. Shefford Road, 21 reported over 8 visits. Stockbridge Road, 7 visits with 25 reported. New Road, 7 visits with 33 reported. Broad Street, 8 visits with 36 reported.

We had the Smiley Sam and publicity material at the Clifton All Saints Academy Fete in June, with a goodly number of the younger visitors racing the equipment. We also had information on the work of the Road Victims Trust, a Bedfordshire non-profit making charitable organisation providing support to those affected by death or life changing injuries resulting from road collisions. Donations made on the day, totalling £17.15, have been passed to the Trust.
