



It's wonderful when Christians can agree with each other. This month we celebrate the 1700th anniversary of the first Ecumenical Council at Nicaea in 325 soon after the Roman Emperor Constantine converted to Christianity.



This key moment in the history of Christian faith aids our ecumenical journey today. The Nicene Creed defined the divinity of Christ, resolving a heresy, and established a date for Easter independent of the Jewish calendar.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Look out for our course on the Nicaean Creed later in the year and come and find out for yourself how we can continue to work together for peace.

There is no I in the Nicaean Creed, WE are working together!


