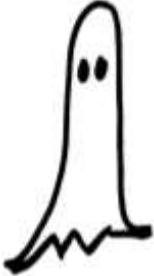

Clifton Neighbourhood Watch



I have received notification from, Rachael Welsh, our Northern Rural Police Sergeant, who assures me her team are continuing with regular patrols in the Clifton village and since Christmas there has been very few issues in Clifton which have required Police attention.

In addition, due to the problems previously happening in our village, our Police colleagues are continuing with Police enforcement around those persons who were causing those issues. Obviously, this continued Police presence is having the desired positive effect of keeping our Community safe.

As stated above, the crime statistics for January showed a marked decrease in criminal activity in our village, with no recorded drug related incidents. However there was an attempted burglary in Stockbridge Road on 10th January, together with two incidents of theft from vehicles in Newis Crescent 2nd January and Broad Street on 17th January. A pedal cycle was stolen in Shefford Road and an incident involving criminal damage to a vehicle occurred in Church Street. Other criminal incidents during January, on the 4th a section 4 incident of provocation and violence also happened in Church Street. Another assault fortunately without injury occurred in Bilberry Road to complete our criminal activity during the month of January.

If you have concerns regarding suspicious vehicles or people, please report to Bedfordshire police via 101 or you may wish to use their new online reporting tool : <https://www.bedfordshire.police.uk/report/Report> giving the reason why you think it is suspicious; dates and times and description of vehicle /person/s. If you can obtain the registration number this can help enormously in their investigation.
