Clifton All Saints Academy



We hope everyone enjoyed the Easter break and didn't eat too much chocolate! Its lovely to see all of the daffodils around the village and the trees in blossom. This time last year it was lockdown for the first time and the weather was certainly much warmer! Little did we know the situation would still be the same a year later. Hopefully it will get warmer soon and we can make the most of being outside in the sun.

We have tried to keep life in school as normal as possible whilst adhering to all of the government guidelines. The children have been amazing, adapting to being taught at home, Google Meets and changes of routines during the school day. It was really lovely to have them all back in at the beginning of March.

On the 23rd March all of the children took part in a minute's silence and tied a yellow ribbon to the school fences reflecting on the past year. Our thoughts and prayers were for all of our staff, pupils, parents and governors who have been affected by COVID-19. Every class chose a style of `cross` and made crosses to be put on the main school gates which I'm sure many of you have seen when walking past. This was our way of marking and celebrating Easter as unfortunately we haven't been able to do so with our usual end of term services in church.

We are hoping, as restrictions gradually lift, that we may be able to return to a little more normality in school and look forward to having whole school Collective Worship in the Hall, Sports Day, visitors in school and other activities.

September 2021 will see a lot of changes at Clifton All Saints Academy. Most of you are aware we will be converting to a Primary school from September 2021 which means the majority of pupils will be staying at Clifton All Saints through to year 6. We are hoping that building work will start later in the summer to provide the additional teaching space needed. Mrs Carol Ward, our Head Teacher, is retiring at the end of this term after joining the school in September 2013. We will be sorry to see her go, but moving forward with all of the exciting changes, we welcome Miss Rebecca Byrne as our new Head Teacher from September.

It is also with great sadness that we say goodbye to, two long standing members of staff, Mrs Gill Evans and Miss Sandy Thomas. Gill has worked in the school office since 1999 so has been at the school for 22years! However, she will be popping in to help with training in-between her dog walks and coffees! Sandy has worked as a full time teaching assistant in our year one class since September 2000 so has also been at the school for 21 years! We wish them both all the very best for the future.

Samuel Whitbread Academy



This term has certainly been one of reflection, with the anniversary of the first lockdown and everyone coming together to remember those we have lost over the last 12 months. Like many of you, staff at school have lost friends and family during the pandemic, and so the minute silence was particularly pertinent to everyone at the academy. Over the last weeks we have spent time during tutor periods to talk to students about the impact of all the restrictions during the pandemic, our health and wellbeing, as well as the light at the end of the tunnel as the restrictions are beginning to be lifted. To mark this moment in history, we have made a reflection video whereby our students and staff voice their thoughts and feelings on the last 12 months, which can be seen on our social media platforms.

Good progress has been made by Mrs Burgoyne on the plans for the memorial garden, which will be situated behind the maths department and outside Learning Support. The design includes a seated area, three fruit trees, flower beds and a pergola. The garden will be a place for those within Samuel Whitbread Academy to sit and quietly reflect, when they need some time to talk to someone or simply be alone. We are planning to have an area where parents and members of the community can also pay for a plaque should they wish, to remember those friends or family who have been lost during the pandemic.

We received the guidance from Ofqual on how schools should assign teacher assessed grades (TAGs) this summer. We are pleased to say that the guidance did not contain any surprises and we are well placed to meet all the requirements in the guidance. This week Mr Butler sent out a booklet containing all the important information concerning the TAGs, which is also available on the website. Students in Year 11 and 13 are busy preparing for their mock exams.

The Academy is supporting a number of charities this year, including Keech Hospice Care, Marie Curie's Day of Remembrance and Marston Vale on behalf of our Eco-School Committee. The non-uniform day donations will be divided amongst our charities. As part of our on-going charity work we are working in partnership with Keech Hospice Care and are supporting their 'Big Trunk Trail', elephant fund-raising initiative. If you haven't seen our baby elephant, Whitney, then please keep an eye on social media, as over the course of the next few months she will be painted and transformed by our students, and will no doubt be making

some appearances around the Academy. Thank you to all those within the community who have made donations via ParentMail.

2. Ring CCS on **07817 614654** to request a volunteer to pick it up and deliver it for you. You will need to tell us when the prescription will be ready to collect and from which pharmacy.

There will be a small charge to cover the volunteers expenses.

If there are no changes to the Government's "Road Map" in the interim we are still on course to re-start the **Tea and Chat get together on Wednesday 23rd June 2021.**



Biggleswade Sandy Lions Club (CIO)



I am writing this article on 11th April and hoping, like everybody else, that the next release from lockdown doesn't cause a surge in new cases of Covid 19. During this lockdown period I have moved from Eastbourne to Gamlingay and have transferred my membership to BS Lions. It has been interesting in that I have not yet met any of the club members face to face. I have met a large number of them on zoom and they are a very friendly club who have made me very welcome.

Now who and what are Lions? We are a group of men and women of all ages and backgrounds who want to make this world a happier and safer place to live. Our meetings tend to be a bit noisy with a lot of laughter BUT we are there to do a job of work so there is always a strong purpose to the meeting. Meetings generally last about an hour to an hour and a half. During that time we will have an update on what is happening locally and internationally, discuss what projects we can support and how we are going to raise the money, and social events.

Anybody who joins can expect to be involved in some way with the two main jobs of fund-raising and service projects. We generally find that members find their niche in one or other of these committees. On top of that there are various other jobs such as organising social events and even Public Relations. I mentioned that people of all ages are welcome and this is very true. The main thing is that you should be reasonably active as attending fetes, helping at senior citizens meetings or helping staff a children's party can be tiring but very rewarding. When it comes to old fogies like me you get jobs like Public Relations Officer which is more sedentary but uses my 34 years of experience as a Lion (yes I am 84 but the oldest Lion I know is 102 and still going strong).

As you can imagine the past 18 months have taken their toll. Not having been able to meet or attend functions we have been unable to recruit new members and those of us who have survived are a year older. We are therefore in need of new members so that we can build on the past and plan for the future. As we come out of lockdown there are going to be lots of people needing our help. Clifton Village News

Bellringing: The inhabitants of Clifton were surprised on Saturday afternoon by a sudden commotion and outburst among the church bells. People came to their doors and enquired the meaning of this extraordinary procedure. There was no wedding celebration of local interest and no great event of national significance to commemorate. After the ringing had ceased, it was ascertained that a certain body of men from **Bedford Change Ringers Association** had visited the village to try their skill on the bells. The place was certainly enlivened, but the parishioners stated that they have heard better ringing from their own ringers.

Sudden Death: The village received rather a shock on Tuesday, soon after midday, by hearing the intelligence of the sudden death of David Stacey, an old parishioner. He had been a little unwell since Saturday but nothing serious was anticipated. Further particulars have not transpired.

Then a village referendum is held to confirm the village wish to adopt the Plan.


